Report from the Froyle Parish Council (FPC)

6th October, 2016

Parish Council Meeting with East Hants District Council

The last Froyle Parish Council ('FPC') meeting was held on 19th September, 2016, and was reported upon in the last village magazine. However, this month's report will concentrate on the FPC's meeting on 4th October with representatives from EHDC concerning planning issues at Froyle Park ('FP').

This meeting took place on 4th October. In attendance were all Parish Councillors, and from EHDC:- Mr J Hassett - Executive Director EHDC, Mr S Jenkins – Head of Planning, Mr N Leach – Senior Lawyer, Cllr. Angela Glass – Planning Portfolio Holder, and Mrs L Wells – Planning and Compliance Manager.

The meeting was chaired by Mrs Julie Southern, FPC Chair. The following summarises the issues discussed.

- It was agreed by all at the meeting that FP has planning permission to operate as a Country Club Hotel (C 1 usage) only, and so as an hotel it may hold events and functions as long as these remain ancillary to the prime function – as an hotel. The FPC strongly contend that FP is not operating as an hotel but as a wedding venue, and thus the operators are in breach of their planning consent.
- At the meeting FPC shared evidence gathered to demonstrate the current use of FP is predominately focused on being a 'dry hire wedding venue'. This therefore completely overtakes any hotel usage, thereby evidencing a breach of the C1 hotel planning permission that has been granted. It was agreed that the evidence gathered and documented by the FPC would be available to EHDC.

Since the meeting EHDC has responded with a letter from Mrs Leslie Wells (6th October 2016). The information FPC provided has been reviewed and in the light of this the matter of the use of FP will be further investigated, which is a priority of the Council. The letter notes, however, that "...this is not a straight forward matter (as is the case with many allegations of changes of use), which may take a number of months before the Council is in a position to make a decision".

The FPC view the response from EHDC as being positive but are frustrated that the investigation could take some time. The FPC will continue to monitor the investigation, contact EHDC to urge them to speed up the process, and report upon its progress.

Monthly meetings with Froyle Park management.

Meanwhile, the FPC continue to attend monthly meetings with the management of Froyle Park. The FPC are keen to aim towards there being a neighbourly and courteous relationship between residents and Froyle Park.

The next Parish Council meeting will be held on 14th November, 2016, at 7.30pm.

Debbie Smith loses Brave Battle with Cancer



Debbie Smith passed away on Wednesday, October 5th following a courageous three-year battle with breast cancer.

Her husband Paul and daughters Frankie and Daisy wish to thank our friends in the village who have supported us and shown such amazing kindness to Debbie over this traumatic period.

Debbie was a journalist for the Aldershot News during the mid-1970s and early 1980s, joining as a junior reporter and eventually becoming the paper's Chief Reporter. She also spent a spell on the Surrey and Hants News based in the Farnham Office where she was known under her maiden name of Comfort.

Debbie went on to freelance for national newspapers including the Sunday Telegraph and she also worked for several years in London at the headquarters of ITV's Teletext Service where she was a theatre critic, travel writer, health and finance specialist. For the past 18 years she has been a co-director Paul Smith Associates PR Agency.

Debbie was cared for by the nursing team at Phyllis Tuckwell Hospice, Farnham, and spent the final three weeks of her life being cared for at Waverley Grange in Farnham.

The funeral service, which was conducted by Debbie's younger brother The Rev Alan Comfort, took place at the Church of St. Michael The Archangel, Aldershot, on Thursday, October 20th, followed by a private family service at Aldershot Crematorium.

November News from The Froyle Archive

Our current focus is on two exhibitions. Firstly the bi-annual Local History Day on October 22nd in the Alton Assembly rooms - hopefully you will have seen the poster on the notice board as it arrived too late for October's magazine. Secondly, the Archive has been asked to mount an exhibition about Froyle in the Village Corner of the Curtis Museum in Alton (*up the stairs from the entrance*). The title is "Froyle - Village of Saints" and will probably run until after Christmas. The next mini-exhibition in the Clive Barter Cabinet at the rear of St Mary's Church (*opposite the Vestments cabinet*) will hopefully be changed on November 9th. The subject currently on display is "Harvest" which will be replaced by "Remembrance", this time concentrating on the Second World War.

Transcription of the Admission Records for Froyle School is now complete, and so we have the names of all children who attended the school from 1868 to April 1914.

Sadly, although we may have all the names and photographs of the children in that period, in the majority of cases we cannot link the name with the photograph! Sometimes, however, we can be lucky as with this picture of Brownjohn's Stores in Lower Froyle in 1908.



From left to right are Alfred's son Charles, then Walter with his hands on his hips. Next to him is his brother Alfred, with arms folded. The little girl is Kitty Collins. The lads on the roof are Alfred's sons, Tom and Harold, and Walter's son, Hubert. We have located all of them in the admission records.





THE VIEW FROM THE VICARAGE

Dear all,

Finishing well

The former Incumbent of St Michael le Belfrey, David Watson, wrote a book about his experience of fighting against cancer, *Fear no Evil*.

Watson recalls:

The asthma persisted, so that I slept badly each night; my legs, ankles and feet blew up like balloons; and my abdomen grew at an astonishing rate until I looked like a pregnant woman. . . My arms and shoulders withered into mere skin and bones. . . I looked more dead than alive.

However, God has been far from inactive in my life. At about 1am . . . I had a bad asthma attack. In my helplessness I cried out to God to speak to me. I'm not very good at listening to God, but between 1am and 3am God spoke to me so powerfully and painfully that I have never felt so broken before him. . .

He showed me that all my preaching, writing and other ministry was absolutely nothing compared to my love relationship with him. . .

God also showed me that my 'love' for him meant nothing unless I was truly able to love from my heart my brother or sister in Christ. As the Lord put various names into my mind I began to write letters to about twelve people asking for forgiveness for hurting them. . . It was the most painful pruning and purging I can remember in my entire Christian life. . .

Whatever else is happening to me physically, God is working deeply in my life. His challenge to me can be summed up in three words: 'Seek my face.' I am not now clinging to physical life (although I still believe that God can heal and wants to heal); but I am clinging to the Lord. I am ready to go and be with Christ for ever. That would be literally heaven. But I am equally ready to stay, if that is what God wants.

'Father, not my will but yours be done.' In that position of security I have experienced once again his perfect love, a love that casts out all fear.


These were the last words he wrote. A man who finished well.




